



9. Historical Significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

Entrance, turned posts, railing at 2nd floor level; cross-gabled ornamented overhang over SW 1st. floor window.

The original owner of this house may well have been Alfred Pierce, a wholesale clothing dealer in Boston. It may have been constructed when Pierce married his first wife, Etta Smith, in 1882.

Pierce sold the property to Camille Fairchild in 1901 (Minute-Man, July 20, 1901) Miss Fairchild is shown as the owner on the 1906 map but by 1908 was living on Waltham St. She was a teacher.
